

BAKERS' ROW

A baker bakes bread, cakes
and pastries.

BARKER STREET

A barker (sometimes called a tanner) makes leather from animal skins. Barker Street can still be found in Shrewsbury.

MARKET STALL HALL

WALLET MAKER LANE

CHAPMAN STREET

A chapman was a merchant - a person who sold goods.

COOKS' ROW

A cook was a person who made food for people to eat.

BUTCHER ROW

A butcher prepares and
sells meat.

CORNMARKET

A cornmarket is where you
might find a grain
merchant.

GLOVERS' ROW

A glover was a person who made gloves.

An archer was a person who used a bow and arrow. The medieval name for this street is Shoplatch, and it is still there today.

made candles.
